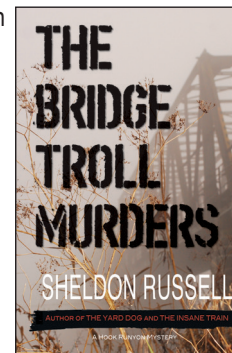
The Bridge Troll Murders
